## K-8 TUITION ASSISTANCE



LESA's **Building Blocks Scholarship Program** offers need-based tuition assistance to students who attend LESA member Lutheran elementary schools in the St. Louis area.

### Who is Eligible?

- Students in grades K-8 attending a Missouri District LCMS School
- At least 10% of the family's income, (taxable and non-taxable), as reported for the previous tax year, is used to cover the cost of their student/s Lutheran school net tuition.
- Families expending less than 10% of their income on Lutheran school tuition will be considered on a case-by-case basis with extenuating circumstances.

The Missouri General Assembly passed HB349 and SB86 which established the Missouri Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program, **MOScholars**. Contributions to non-profit Educational Assistance Organizations are used to award scholarships to Missouri students.

### Who is Eligible?

- **Students in grades K-8** who are a Missouri resident and resides in a county with a charter form of government or a city with at least 30,000 residents and meets one of the following criteria:
  - Students having an approved Individualized Education Plan (IEP) developed under the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
  - Student is a member of household whose total annual income does not exceed an amount equal to 100% of the income standard used to qualify for free and reduced lunches, and meets at least **one** of the following:
    - Attended a public school as a full-time student for at least 1 semester during the previous 12 months OR
    - Is a child who is eligible to begin *Kindergarten* or *First Grade*.
