Life After Death: Your Fishing Story

15 When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs."
16 Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep."

17 The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep. 18 Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." 19 Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, "Follow me!" John 21

In each of our stories, no matter what it looks like, Jesus walks with us with His words meant to restore and turn us toward Him. It is a story that calls us to turn from the world and its deceitfulness. To turn from foolish fishing in dangerous waters and to walk with Jesus and follow Him.

In the end, we all have a fishing story to tell; The ways and the moments when Jesus appeared to us and we became His disciples. A story that is our story to share with others as we follow Jesus.

SAUSAGE CREAM CHEESE TATER TOT BREAKFAST CASSEROLE Ingredients: 2 lb. breakfast sausage 1 (8-oz) package cream cheese, softened 1 (30-32oz) bag frozen tater tots 1 tsp salt 1/2 tsp pepper 1/4 tsp garlic powder 1/4 tsp garlic powder 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese 8 eggs 2 cups milk

Instructions:

 Preheat oven to 350°F.
 Lightly spray a 9xl3-inch pan with cooking spray.
 In a large skillet, cook sausage until no longer pink. Drain fat. Add cream cheese to skillet and mix with cooked sausage.
 In a large bowl, toss together tater tots, sausage, and cream cheese mixture, and shredded cheddar cheese.
 Pour into a lightly greased 9xl3-inch pan.
 Whisk together eggs, salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder and milk. 7. Pour over tater tot mixture.
 Bake uncovered for 60 - 70 minutes, or until eggs are set.

Born in 1707, Charles was the youngest of 18 children and was one of only 10 who lived to adulthood. Charles' father and brother were heavily involved in the church and Charles became ordained as a priest in the Church of England in 1735. Along with his brother, John, Charles was instrumental in the starting of the Methodist movement.

He served as a priest of a single parish for only 2 years until the vicar he was serving with told him he shouldn't be a pastor anymore. After that, he became an itinerant pastor and spent a lot of time serving with his brother, John, also a priest. Many of his 6,500 hymn texts were written to accompany sermons given by John.

Wesley references verses from all but 4 books of the Bible. It's been said that his hymns clothe Christ in flesh and blood and gives converts a belief to grasp, embrace a personal faith. May we be bold to spread that same timeless message in our daily lives!
